

March 15, 2022

On March 14, 2022, the Board of Trustees of Platte County School District #2 opened their Regular Meeting at 7:00 PM. This report covers the major items of business at this meeting. In addition, you are given a listing of topics, which will come up for discussion or action at future Board meetings.

1. Public Comment – None

2. **Mr. Flaherty - Facilities**

- ❖ Mr. Flaherty informed the trustees that the Airpro was in the building on March 8th. They serviced and repaired the UMA-750 filtration unit on the welding side. An expansion to the wood shop system to cover extra saws is being investigated.
- ❖ The district has received an estimate on replacing the 3 Elementary multi-zone HVAC units. The price includes Factory installed Merv14 filters and GPS Needle-Point Bi-Polar ionization system to kill 99.4% of flu airborne particles. The existing units are 20 years old and showing signs of fatigue on major internal parts. Mr. Flaherty is finalizing the specs and will go out to bid this week.
- ❖ Mr. Flaherty and Mr. Schuldies found a vehicle that is wheelchair ready and will be delivered with Hepa-3 filtration and clean transit 12 nozzle decontamination system. Mr. Flaherty has sent out specs to all local dealerships, which are due back Friday, March 18th. There is a 12 to 18 month delivery time on anything that is ordered new.

3. **Mrs. Sisson – K-12 Principal**

- ❖ Mrs. Sisson reported that K-12 enrollment is at 230.
- ❖ The Basketball season has come to an end and that the students played well.
- ❖ National Honor Society Induction took place and Mrs. Sisson thanked Mrs. Baker for all her help in making this happen.
- ❖ A Pi Day Celebration took place with a celebration on Monday, March 14th. There were two students who won awards by reciting digits. Eighth grade student Korbin Weinkauf recited 45 digits and 4th grade student Aiden Harris recited 44 digits.
- ❖ Wednesday, March 16 there will be a Little Vikes' Family Night 5:15 to 6:00 PM.
- ❖ "The Unstoppable You" presentation has been rescheduled for the week of April 20th - 22nd.
- ❖ Parent Teacher Conferences are scheduled for April 11th and 12th. Mrs. Martin is in the process of scheduling the elementary conferences and letters of conference times will be going out to parents in the near future.
- ❖ Mrs. Sisson and Mrs. Schuldies shared some ideas with the trustees as a potential solution to the ACT Readiness for the district's students.

4. **Mr. Beard – District**

- ❖ Mr. Beard asked the trustees for a couple volunteers to take part on the Professional Relations Agreement meeting that will take place in the near future. Board members Zapf, Anderson and Seyfang volunteered.
- ❖ Mr. Beard congratulated the High School Basketball Teams for a great year and congratulated Brian McCoid who was selected as the Wyoming Class 1A Southeast basketball player of the year.
- ❖ Informed the board the Business Manager, Nikki Quynn, will begin working on the budget for the 2022-2023 school year.
- ❖ Superintendent Beard thanked all staff and students who helped with the memorial services for student Karson Yorges, a senior at Guernsey-Sunrise High School, who was killed in an automobile accident on March 7th.

The Board of Trustees took the following actions at their meeting; approved Minutes of February 14, 2022; approved the financials and paying of the bills as presented; approved the adoption of Policy GBI - Staff Participation In Political Activities on 2nd and final reading; tabled agenda item #10 approval of Job Descriptions of Reading Interventionist and Math Interventionist until the

Special Board Meeting on Wednesday, March 23, 2022 to discuss the job descriptions; the trustees also set up a workshop for March 29th to discuss the potential solution to the ACT Readiness for the district's students; approved the 2021-2022 Audit from Auditor Cynthia Olson from Skogen, Cometto & Associates, approved the hiring Kristin Nash, Bus Driver; accepted the resignations from Gloria Adamson, English; Glenn Freeburg, A.D; Linda Victory, Special Ed Director; Mindy Kelley, Assistant Girls Basketball, and Tracy Pare, Assistant Principal.

6. Board Comment - Board member Zapf stated he was excited about setting bars for our students. Board member Reichert asked Superintendent Beard if the district had received any applicants for the vacancies the district has for next year. She also thanked the staff for all they did to help each other and students get through the week after receiving the notice of student Karson Yorges' accident and death. Board member Anderson also thanked staff for all they did to help fellow staff members and students get through last week. Board member Anderson also talked a little about the Teammate Mentoring Program and the possibility of a field trip this summer for the students involved in the program.
